Title: God making himself known

- You're sitting in a Scripture class mid-way through high school.
- Some smarty asks the teacher "how do you know?"
- "You're telling us all this stuff about God how do you know?"
- "have you ever seen God"?
- And the scripture teacher says 'no'
- "Has God ever spoken to you?"
- And the teacher says 'no' 'not directly...'
- ...so the smarty says 'then be quiet' (though not as politely) 'you're wasting our time....'
- "...you're talking to us about God who you've never seen, you've never spoken to not heard from you're wasting our time...." //
- Well that actually raises a very important question how can any one actually know anything about God?
- We haven't seen him... and most of the people who say they hear his voice are in need of all sorts of help..
- So how does anyone **seriously** know **anything** about **God**?
- For every **opinion** that you might have about God there are millions of **other** intelligent humans who strongly disagree with you.
- No one as ever seen God, says the Bible in our reading John 1:18...
- But everyone seems to have an **opinion** on God...!
- And everyone's <u>opinion</u> is worth the same amount which is nothing.
- So we have **opinions** but we're **unqualified** because no one has ever **seen God**. ///
- it is important to distinguish between having **opinions** and something that is **true**.
- ...a difference between a theory that is based on NO solid evidence, and something that is based on GOOD solid fact.

- A difference between **ideas** and things that can be **proven**. //
- Woody Allen "all of my humour is a response to the **silence** of **God**."
- He's a fairly depressed bloke because he considers that all the big questions of life have no answer because God has been silent.
- Jean-Paul Sartre "That God is silent it is impossible for me to deny. That my whole body cries out to him – is impossible for me to forget."
- Socrates said we have to wait until a god comes from the gods or until they send a human being who can tell us of the gods...
- Jesus himself said John 6:46 no one has seen the Father... ///
- **EXCEPT** ... **EXCEPT** the ONE who is from God only **he** has seen the Father.
- **No one** is **qualified // except** the one who has **come** from the **Father**.
- That is a very large claim that Jesus makes but reading through John's gospel it's the most common claim he makes for himself: that he is the one who has come from the Father.
- **He** is the **exception**: the one who has **seen God**.
- Back to John 1:18 the one and only Son who is himself God and is in closest relationship with the Father – has made him known.
- because God cares about us because he respects the mind he has given us; he sends us someone qualified to speak. //
- we are spending Advent asking and hopefully answering the question well Who is Jesus?
- ...and this is what Christmas is about... Jesus truly comes FROM God TO earth and lives among us as one of us...
- He comes from his Father, uniquely qualified and he will tell us of his Father he will reveal the Father to us - not as if he's just one person with an interesting and beautiful set of opinions, but as one who is **qualified** to **speak**... because he's come from the Father...
- Bono U2 said this in an interview a few years back... "the secular response to the Christ story always goes like this – he was a great **prophet**, he was a very **interesting** guy....
-But actually Christ doesn't allow you to do that he doesn't let you off that hook Christ says no I'm not just saying I'm a teacher, don't just call me a teacher, I'm not saying I'm a prophet, I'm saying I'm the Messiah, I'm saying I'm God in the flesh...
- Let's have a look...
- And so plenty of people say please just be a **prophet** a prophet I can take.... Or a teacher... but don't mention the M word – the Messiah word – because we're going to have to crucify you if you do

that..."

- But he goes 'no' actually I am the Messiah!
- ...at this point everyone just keeps staring at their shoes and saying 'O my goodness, he's going to keep saying this'... so you're left with either that Christ was who he said he was - the Messiah - or else he's completely (as Bono said) – totally nuts.... very seriously deluded.... //
- ... So the question is... in the end what do WE make of this man?
- **No one** in history makes claims like **him**.
- He's not just another prophet.
- John 14 Philip says if we can just see the Father we'll be satisfied. Its been a great three years Jesus - terrific miracles – great fun – but if we could just see God.
- And do you remember what Jesus says back to him? its extraordinary what he says...
- John 14:9 Philip have I been with you so long and yet you still don't know who I am? If you have seen me, you've seen the Father.
- Now no one would say that no one would **think** to say that.
- there's no way in a thousand light years that Mohammed would ever say that to his followers... if you want to see what Allah is like - look at me...
- Its an extraordinary thing that Jesus a flesh and blood human being at that time says if you want to know **God** is like – **look** at **me**. ///
- Its not MY opinion verses YOUR opinion as if they're all worth the same.
- Its **OUR** opinion verses **HIS opinion**.
- The **opinion** of the **qualified** one.
- Will I be convinced? Will I look at it?
- Because here at last is the answer to Socrates' longing and John Paul Sartre's sadness and Woody Allen's depression... they are simply mistaken on their first statement /// its just not true that God has not spoken.
- God has spoken very clearly. ///
- A Few Good Men is that clear? Crystal clear!
- Continuing to quote that classic movie...
- I want the **truth** I have a **right** to the **truth**, I **demand** to know the **truth**.

- You want to know the **truth**? you can't **handle** the **truth**.
- And friends I don't mean to be rude but that's a bit true for many of us today... the Bible is saying you want the **truth... really**?
- Well I wonder whether you can handle the truth.
- I wonder if you're willing to say to God God if its true show me, and if its true, I'll go wherever the truth leads me... no matter how humbling that may be after years of arguing against it... //
- I wonder if you can pray that prayer? you mightn't even be sure there's a God there but God if you're there... and you'll show me the things that are real and true, I'll go with it...
- Or whether in the end there are many of us who like to talk to the talk and have arguments, but in the end, we can't **handle** the **truth**.
- We actually prefer **ignorance** because its far less **demanding**... ////
- "No one has ever seen God, who is himself God and is in closest relationship with the Father, has made him known."
- What are we going to do with this guy who makes this enormous claim?
- Are we going to **look** at it, have the courage to **look** at it? // Or **ignore** it...? //
- Ok let me draw things to a close
- If Jesus is God making himself known... what sort of God did he reveal him to be?
- When you see Jesus look with love on someone he's about to heal... you see God's love
- When you see Jesus look with love on a paralysed man needing forgiveness, you see God's love
- When you see Jesus' patience with his disciples who were slow to learn, you see God's patience
- When you see Jesus' care for those who had been listening to him but had nothing to eat, you see God's care
- When you see Jesus' compassion for the lost who had no shepherd, you see God's compassion for the lost
- When you Jesus' authority over evil spirits, over people, as a teacher, authority over illness and creation – and even over death – you see God's authority
- When you see Jesus humbly going to the cross you see God's commitment to reconcile us to himself through the death of his Son...
- When you see Jesus' forgiveness at the cross for those who drove in the nails, you see God's forgiveness

- And when you see Jesus after his resurrection sending his disciples into all the world to make disciples, you see the mission heart of God...! ///
- Who is Jesus...?
- He came to **show** us the **Father**.
- He is **God**, making **himself known**.
- The question is // do we really want to know? //
