Read Acts 17:16-21

- **2.** When Paul came into Athens, what did he see and how did he react? Why did he react in this way? How should we react when we see a world that worships its modern-day idols?
- **3.** Who did Paul reason with? Who would have been in the marketplace? How did they respond to Paul?
- 4. What do Epicureans and Stoics believe with regard to god/s? (Google is your friend!)
- 5. Why do you think some considered Paul a 'babbler'?
- 6. How important do you think it is for preachers to understand their audience?

Read Acts 17:22-31

- 6. How does Paul show that he has done his homework on this audience?
- **7.** How is this presentation of the gospel different to some others in Acts (ie, what is included vs what is left out)?
- 8. Why is it important to know that God is all-powerful and doesn't need to be served by humans? How might this be different to common beliefs about God in Australian culture?
- 9. In what ways has God made it possible to know him? (see also Eccl 3:11; Rom 1:19-20)
- 10. Why then do people exchange this knowledge of God in favour of worshipping other gods?
- **11.** How might Paul's speech have resonated with those who believed in distant, unknowable god/s?
- 12. Jesus only gets mentioned in the last bit of Paul's speech. How does he fit in to what Paul is saying?

Read Acts 17:32-34

- 11. What are the three responses to Paul's message?
- 12. Why should we bother getting to know our audience and our message?
