Synod News

Synod 2023 took place from 15-16 September. The proceedings began with a service of Holy Communion at the Cathedral at 7 pm on the 15th and resumed with the business session at 9 am on the 16th in the parish hall at Kelso. Over 70 delegates attended, accompanied by 5-6 observers. Overall, it was an uplifting event, with many reasons for gratitude.

A highlight was the **new parish admin ordinance.** It sailed through synod with minimal debate and without the need to move into committee. While most changes focused on updating the language, several significant alterations were also introduced; for example:

- Differentiating the parish ordinance from the admin ordinance for clarity and ease of reference.
- Elections for office bearers, aside from synod reps, will once again be held annually.
- Parishes will no longer have centre wardens for remote churches. Instead, each parish will have three wardens: one appointed by the Priest and two elected by the congregation.

Upon finalisation and endorsement, these two separated ordinances will be circulated to parishes and uploaded to the diocesan website.

Additional motions included:

- A request that the bishop's video sermons continue.
- Establishing a panel to address family violence.
- Expressing gratitude to Archdeacon Watterson.
- Adopting a pastoral supervision policy for clergy.
- Reviewing minimum standards for parish cars.
- Advocating for indigenous representation at synod.

Bishop writes

In my Presidential Address to synod, I drew inspiration from the account of Joseph, who because of his big view of God, could see that what his brothers meant for harm, God had used for good. I urged us all to adopt a similar perspective of God's work in our diocese, recognising his unique capacity to bring good from harm – as he did at the cross.

While acknowledging the many challenges our diocese has faced—financial issues, questionable past decisions, abuse, and the subsequent erosion of trust, I pointed out that the Lord is at work to bring good from harm.

I highlighted the perseverance of our parishes without clergy and recognised their unwavering commitment to maintaining their ministry. I also mentioned the positive signs and developments in our parishes *with* clergy.

I expressed our collective gratitude for the invaluable financial support from the Sydney Diocese, the Bush Church Aid Society, our partner churches, and dedicated individuals. I wondered whether the EMF might form the basis of a new capital fund.

Given our pressing need for more clergy, I proposed some possible ways we might support our clergyless parishes. This includes forging partnerships within the diocese, sourcing traveling locums, and harnessing technology for livestreaming services.

Lastly, I stressed the urgent need to foster a culture shift within our diocese. Steering away from past suspicions and divisions, I urged a future marked by compassion, kindness, and unity. I concluded by urging us to centre our efforts around **SHARING JESUS FOR LIFE**; prayer, and inviting God's transforming work in our hearts.
