6 Who is calling the shots?

When we humble ourselves before the Lord

- 1. We won't put others down 4:11-12
- 2. We won't push God aside 4:13-17

- Have you ever woken up to someone shining a torch on you?
- You know what people always say in that situation... "Are you awake??"
- And the answer is always, "Well, I am now!" //
- James has been shining the light on **all aspects** of our lives throughout this book.
- Are you awake?
- How have you survived?
- It's been challenging hasn't it?? ///
- Do we see **trials** as the work of **God** to help us **grow**?
- Do we only ever <u>hear</u> God's word and never do anything about what we hear?
- are we looking after the widows and orphans of our time?
- Do we treat people who can give us something differently to those who can't give us anything?
- If you were arrested for being a Christian would there be enough evidence to convict you?
- Have you tamed your tongue?
- Does your wisdom arise from your reverent awe of God or are you so in awe of yourself that you
 are your own source of wisdom?
- And are you flirting with the world while claiming friendship with God?? ////
- Like being in a huge surf if you head to the coast for your summer holidays getting hit by one wave
 of challenge after another...
- And you might be thinking **enough** James! Give us a **break!**
- And he did /// last week. //
- With tender words of **compassion**.... as if to say I know I've thrown a lot at you... so let me encourage you God **gives** us more **grace**.... 4:6
- Let me assure you that when you resist the devil, he WILL flee!!
- Let me comfort you when you draw near to God he will draw near to you.... //
- And when you grieve your sin and wash your hands and purify your hearts... that is when you humble yourselves before the Lord.... // He will lift you up!! ////
- ALL of that is important context for today's passage in James 4:11-17.

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- It is the end of last week's passage taken a little further...
- So we're exploring the *implications* of humbling ourselves before the Lord.... -v10.
- What does he mean? And what will it look like?
- To **humble** ourselves before the **Lord** is similar to the description of **wisdom** we've explored... is to have that **right** and **appropriate reverent awe** of **God**....
- It is to stand with Job of the Old Testament who at the end of that great book says:
 - "I know that you can do **all things**; **no** purpose of yours can be **thwarted**." Job 42:1
 - Or again in v3: "Surely I spoke of things I did not understand, things too wonderful for me to know". (Job 42:3)
- The remainder of James' letter then, spells out what will happen when we humble ourselves before
 the Lord...
- And we'll see two outcomes this morning and three outcomes next week...
- This morning:

When we humble ourselves before the Lord

- 1. We won't put others down 4:11-12
- 2. We won't push God aside 4:13-17
- So; first:
- 1. We won't put others down 4:11-12
- Let's have a look at vv11-12 again Brothers and sisters, do not slander one another. Anyone who speaks against a brother or sister or judges them speaks against the law and judges it. When you judge the law, you are not keeping it, but sitting in judgment on it. ¹² There is only one Lawgiver and Judge, the one who is able to save and destroy. But you—who are you to judge your neighbour?
- Remember the context is **humility** and that leads James to go directly to this issue of **slander** presumably because slander arises from the very **opposite** of being humble.
- When we **slander** another person, we put them **down**.
- And often we like to put people down because it makes us feel that we've just gone a little higher up ourselves.
- If I can run you down, then I may feel a little better about myself //
- I am aware of my own shortcomings... if I can find someone worse than me, then I won't feel as bad about myself... rather I'll feel a little superior a little self-righteous! //
- The word translated 'slander' here means 'to speak against'.
- It doesn't mean so much to talk down to another but to talk another; down!
- That is, this sort of talk most often happens behind someone's **back**... done in a **cowardly** way where the person concerned is not around to **respond** to any **allegations**!
- It's related to **gossip** isn't it?
- It involves reports about someone else that are more often than not **false**... repeating stories about someone which are **uncollaborated**... where we pass on confidential **titbits** of **information** which can actually **destroy** the good name of those not **present** to defend **themselves**! //

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- And James says make sure you don't think someone has died and made YOU the judge of the world... that someone has put you in charge of what is right and wrong....
-make sure while we're on the subject of the **tongue** which we were last week that you're not **using** your **tongue** to speak against your **brothers** and **sisters**, putting them **down**!
- Furthermore, we often impute **motives** about which we're in no **position** to **judge!**
- We'll say oh well the only reason **she's** helping is because.... such and such... and the only reason he's saying **that** is because of **this**....
- And James says 'who do you think you are'? Who are you to judge your neighbour in that way?
 You don't know the motives of people's hearts. ///
- Does this happen in your church?
- Has it destroyed relationships and trust?
- Are there people no longer coming because of this sort of thing? ///
- It is **SO** damaging and precisely the **opposite** to how we should behave as we humble ourselves before **God**! //
- This sort of behaviour has to **stop**.
- It has to stop in **obedience** to the **Word** of **God** and is **submission** to the **Spirit** of **God**! ///
- Picking up the exhortation from last week's passage if this is behaviour which has become a pattern in your life you need to call it sin... and you need to grieve, mourn and wail that sin! //
- And then we need to say with John Newton "I am a great sinner but Christ is a great Saviour" –
 and we need to rest in what Jesus has done on the cross... and go and sin no more! //
- One more thing to say on this... as it is often confused...
- James, in telling us not to judge..., is not calling for us to set aside our critical **faculties**.... It is not as if we're **NEVER** to judge another's actions...
- This is very, very important, because we need to **protect** young people.... And all of our safe ministry protocols are designed to help us make a **judgement** call about whether a person will provide a **safe context** for **children**!
- it's not uncommon to hear people use Jesus' warning against judging as a basis for accepting behaviour which the Bible actually **condemns**. Am I right?
- So, for example, let's say we have something that is clearly set out in Scripture as being **unacceptable**, whatever it might be. And then someone says, "I noticed that Mr. X is involved in y," and someone says, "Well, 'Judge not, that you be not judged."
- That's not actually what James is on about here. He's not asking us to muddy the waters of Scripture.... Or turn a blind eye to sin....
- Rather, James is talking about when we enter into **superficial**, **misguided**, **uninformed**, **cruel** judgments, behind people's **backs**... **THAT** is what he is **addressing**.
- Jesus said by their fruit you will know them inferring that there will indeed be a time when you
 make certain judgement calls.... But it will always be, after you've removed the log out of your own
 eye first! //
- Let me finish this section with this quote: "The knowledge of our own failings makes us more and more hesitant about expressing any form of criticism of others. The person who knows themselves, learns an increasing silence before other people's faults." (Derek Prime)

Preaching Christ....

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- That's a great quote. "The man or the woman who knows themselves, learns an increasing silence before others' faults."
- This is not **cowardness** or **softness**, but rather it is **Christlikeness** and it is **tenderness**. //
- For when we humble ourselves before God, we won't put others down. /
- And if we humble ourselves before God:
- 2. We won't push God aside 4:13-17
- Have a look with me at v13: Now listen, you who say 'Today or tomorrow we will go to this or that city, spend a year there, carry on business and make money'
- These were **boom** times in the 1st century.
- The Roman empire was growing
- Travel was easy thanks to the Roman roads
- Trade was increasing
- And at the time James wrote, millions of dollars was being spent by wealthy citizens on luxuries from India, China and Arabia spices, jewellery, silk, perfume etc.
- But James' brother had earlier said 'So do not worry, saying, 'what shall we eat?' or 'what shall we drink' or 'what shall we wear?'. For the pagans run after all these things. Matthew 6:31-32
- Now traders had been around for years but with the increasing wealth of the time more and
 more people were running after all these things and aspiring to and dreaming of great wealth as a
 result.
- Think of our boom times of the past.
- Think of people bring drawn for the first time in to starting their own small business, or trading the stock market...
- now there's nothing wrong with an entrepreneurial spirit...
-but there is arrogance here....
- people were moving smugly up the social scale and waving smugly at those they passed.
- You can hear the conversation in the market place 'oh yes, I have a shipment of spices arriving tomorrow from Egypt. I'll be taking them down to Ephesus on Tuesday before heading to Rome for some trade negotiations there.
- And James responds v14 why, you do not know what will happen tomorrow. What is your life? You are a **mist** that appears for a little while and then vanishes.
- James is right. The precious stock could be shipwrecked on the way from Egypt, the merchandise could be raided on the way to Ephesus, the households of Rome could fine a cheaper price from another merchant.
- Or a fire could gut your house the day before you plan to move out.
- Or you could be killed in an ambush before you know it.
- Who knows what will happen tomorrow?
- Or this afternoon?
- Our lives even successful ones are simply a 'mist' appearing and disappearing without a trace.

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- Reminds us of James' words in Ch 1 the rich man will fade away even while he goes about his business.
- Now friends we need to hear this don't we? //
- Because we're often arrogant.
- often making plans without any reference to God
- often think we're a lot more important than we are.
- And we can all boast about our life or plans or deals or... whatever... in other words we often think
 we're in control of our money, our holidays, our portfolios... our property... we can be very
 presumptuous... and pretty independent of God... //
- James isn't saying 'don't make plans'.
- He's not saying 'don't trade'
- He <u>IS</u> saying do everything under the **banner** the **umbrella** of or with the **mindset** of '<u>if the</u> **Lord wills'**.
- In **humility** we need to acknowledge the **supremacy** of God in all of **life**.
- He rules.
- If the Lord wills, we will do this or that.
- I think Christians around 2 -3 decades ago used to live more consciously like that...
- 'see you Sunday God willing'
- I'm going overseas in June God willing'
- 'I'm off to see the family in Melbourne on Friday God willing'.
- 'See you down by the river for the picnic God willing'
- I remember my parents and their friends and other people at church talking like that.
- "D.V. & W.P" they used to say.... a combination of "Deo volente" God willing and "weather permitting."
- Of course, the mere adding of words doesn't change things... we need a change of heart here...
- We need to live knowing we're not in charge.
- We need to bring our plans to God
- We need to **humble** ourselves before God **submit** ourselves to him.
- We need to know that he rules... he reigns... we need to live like we <u>believe</u> that line we pray every week 'your will be done'!! ///
- And remember the last line of this section...?
- v17 anyone who knows the good they ought to do and doesn't do it, sins"!
- that is we now know that we need to surrender to the sovereign will of God in our lives... that is
 the good we ought to do... and we if don't live this way James says, we sin! ///
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- I long that every member of our church right across the diocese... including me... would take pause today to humble ourselves before God...

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- Can we stand with Job and say? "I know that you can do all things; no purpose of yours can be thwarted."
- Stand before our great God with reverent awe. ///
- For if we humble ourselves before the Lord, he will lift us up!
- If we humble ourselves before the Lord; we won't put others down won't slander them behind their back, considering ourselves as so wonderfully superior...
- If we humble ourselves before the Lord, we won't push God aside...!
- And every plan we make every step we take every choice every decision... every prayer.... will always... be.... after the pattern of the Lord Jesus....with the clear understanding of "yet not my will, but yours be done..."
