3
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- On that day, we will see You
 - Shining brighter than the sun
 - On that day, we will know You
 - As we lift our voice as one
 - 'Til that day, we will praise You
 - For Your never-ending grace
 - And we will keep on singing on that glorious day. ////
- On that day we will SEE you! //
- Shining brighter than the sun! ////
- Have you ever stopped to contemplate what that will be like....?
- To see Jesus face to face...
- To see in his face his love, his compassion, his grace...?? ///
- But I feel we've jumped ahead and that some background would be helpful...
- So here's where we are heading today!
- Two simple points...
 - 1. See him and die!
 - 2. See him and <u>live</u>!

1. See him and die

- Many people say and you've probably heard it said 'I'd believe in God if he would just turn up and show himself!'
- People think they'd like to see God!
- But right throughout the Bible we see that's it is actually terrifying to see God!!
- Do you remember the vision the prophet Isaiah saw in Isaiah Chapter 6?
- That is a humbling reminder, that in fact we'd surely rather not see God.
- For it would be... terrifying.
- Isaiah 6:1 In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord seated on a throne, high and exalted, and the **train** of his **robe** filled the **temple**. //
- Enthroned high and lifted up. This is no little equal God.
- He is in charge. We are not.

- This is a God who is **better**, **bigger**, **higher**, more **exalted**.
- we don't meet God as an **equal**
- He is far above and exalted above us. //
- Now the temple in Jerusalem in 740BC was a magnificent building. Huge foundations. Magnificent timber work.
- And yet in this **vision** he has, it says the train or hem of God's garment completely fills the temple.
- The hem of my trousers is about 2 centimetres. Yet in this vision, the hem of God's garment **fills** the **temple**. We're meant to get a sense from this vision, just how enormous God is!
- You don't have a nice warm **glowing experience** when you first meet this God.
- You fall on your knees trembling. //
- And the seraphs these angelic figures do you recall what they are crying out...? Not LOVE LOVE LOVE. No, they are calling HOLY HOLY HOLY ///
- It's the song sung to God and to Jesus the Lamb in the book of Revelation...
- It means that God is like nothing like us he's separate from different to us...
- God is unlike **you** and unlike **me**... he's in a completely **different category**.
- He doesn't think like you, act like you, do things like you. He is completely 'other'. ///
- And suddenly Isaiah cries out in despair. /
- Isaiah 66 "Woe to me!" I cried. "I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the Lord Almighty."
- He says 'I am ruined!'
- The word means '**unpicked'** like when unpick a garment and pull it apart into its various little bits of shapes of fabric.
- He's saying 'my whole being is being torn to pieces because I am an unclean man'.
- He sees God and becomes immediately aware of his sin and corruption....
- The understanding was right back to Moses... that you **couldn't** see God and **live**.
- With your stain and rebellion your uncleanness your UNholiness.... you cannot be in the same place as God.
- And Isaiah figures he has no right to live.
- Brothers and sisters this the terrifying holiness of God. //
- We are all so casual about sin and our own state before God aren't we?
- People think they're going to rock up to God and say 'G'day mate'...
- No friends this is the reality... this is what God is like. And if he were to turn up, we'd just want him to go away. /
- His holiness would be unbearable. //
- Yet what we go on to see in Isaiah's vision, is God's amazing grace!
- something extraordinary happens... a beautiful thing happens.
- One of the seraphs comes right up to Isaiah with a coal and burns his lips not to kill him but to

transform him.

- And the seraph says to him (v7), 'see this has touched your lips, your guilt is taken away and your sin is atoned for.'
- And it's one of those difficult things to get our heads around with Christianity... /// that is, that God is saying that sin is so much more frighteningly <u>serious</u> than we know or are willing to admit... but God <u>loves</u> to deal with it atone for it take it away forgive it!
- What we see clearly in Isaiah is **this wonderful liberal**, lavish, free grace... which says to Isaiah... you're forgiven... God will take away your sin... ! //
- Like the **tax collector** in Jesus' story who simply said 'have mercy on me a sinner' and went home right with God.
- and the son who admitted he admitted his unworthiness to his father and was welcomed home with a party
- and the woman who aware she had been forgiven much poured perfume over Jesus' feet.
- Or the woman caught in adultery to whom Jesus says 'go and sin no more'...
- Like the **millions of people** in the last 2000 years have come to realise on the one hand the **horror** of their **sin** but on the other the **beauty** of **forgiveness**... which comes through Jesus' **death and resurrection** ///
- So now with that background, we can turn to our **extraordinary** and **wonderful advent hope**:

2. See him and live

- Now look with me at Revelation 22
- The passage is full of imagery of course... but I want you to notice the **life** in the heavenly city of Jerusalem (a far cry from that earthly city right now....)
- Have a look with me from 22:1 Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, as clear as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb² down the middle of the great street of the city. On each side of the river stood the tree of life...
- The river of the water of life... and the tree of life
- What had Jesus promised those who came to him? John 4:13 whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life?
- Here is the absolute **fulfillment** of that promise... there's **rivers** of **living water** here!
- And do you remember when Adam and Eve were put **out** of the Garden of Eden in Genesis 3:24? *After he drove the man out, he placed on the east side of the Garden of Eden cherubim and a flaming sword flashing back and forth* **to guard the way to the tree of life.**
- Access to the tree of life **cut off!**
- What do we see here in Rev 22?
- That the curse has been **reversed**... there's a tree on **each side** of the **river**... there's no longer any **curse** on **humankind**.. and what is more, we are told that the **leaves** of the **tree** are for the **healing** of the **nations**... that is, the **pain** and **suffering** of **humanity** throughout **history** will be **no more**!!
- Let's pick up the passage again from v3 No longer will there be any **curse**. The throne of God and of the **Lamb** will be in the city, and his servants will serve him. ⁴ **They will see his face**...

- We his **servants**... will **serve** or **worship** the **Lamb of God Jesus** the **lamb of God** who has taken away the curse of our **sin**... and then do you see? <u>we shall see his face!!!</u> //
- We shall his face... and yet: we'll have no fear!!
- We won't be thinking we are about to lose our life because we've seen his face...
- we won't be thinking like Isaiah did that seeing his face will be our **undoing**!!
- We will see his face and <u>live</u>... because our **unholiness** has been **taken away** our sin **atoned** for **and** we will be **perfectly renewed** in the **image** of **God**!!
- Can you **imagine**...??
- centuries of fearing that you could never see God's face and live... The full glory of God <u>never</u> available to sinful humankind...
- But on that day we shall see his face!! ///
- We will see...

His **beauty**

His glory

His majesty

We shall in his face his love, his mercy, his compassion...

We shall see his understanding... his kindness...

We will see Jesus!

Our Saviour; our rescuer; the one who died and rose again

We shall see our **Lord**... the **king of Kings**... the **Lord of Lords**... who has triumphed over the **evil one**... and whose reign of **righteousness** will **never end**...!

- Brothers and sisters you may be sitting there this morning saying "Mark so what?"
- How is this going to change **tomorrow**...?
- You wouldn't **believe** my life now I'm hard pressed financially, I live with unbearable pain, there are family members from whom I'm estranged; the kids are driving me crazy and the holidays have barely begun; I need a job; have you seen my medical bills...? I can't even begin to think about Christmas...!
- ...and you're telling me about something in the distant future about seeing Jesus' face? //
- I hear you...!
- So what difference *does* this make?
- three things all begin with P I hope you might remember them...
- Perspective... Advent is about lifting our eyes from ourselves, our circumstances... from the muck of this world... to the return of Jesus and the world to come
- Sometimes when we are in the thick of things, it's hard to have perspective...
- ... I love going up Mt Panorama because you see the lie of the land... how the pieces fit together. There's perspective...
- Advent is meant to give us perspective... yes this world and our life now is full of challenges... and not for a moment do I want to trivialise those... but there is a world to come which will be absolutely

Preaching Christ....

...by the power of the Holy Spirit

...and the authority of the Word of God

glorious... and we still stand on that great **day** in the **glory** and **wonder** of the **new creation** and see Jesus **face to face**... //

- And with that perspective we see what really matters our **relationship** with **Jesus** our **forgiveness**... among all our needs our **<u>GREATEST</u>** need has **already been met // by Jesus!**
- So perspective; then:
- Perseverance –

...the **perspective**, helps us to **persevere**... Paul calls all that we're going through now '**light and momentary troubles'**... and **gaining** that perspective, **helps** us keep **going**... because something **better** is coming... and what we face now really **is short** and **temporary**...

- when you're putting in a long hard day at work or on the land or whatever it is you're helped to persevere, knowing the end is in sight...
- friends the end is in sight... it may only be moments away when we shall see his face...!
- Perspective, perseverance... and:
- Presence –

...because **that same Jesus** upon whom we look forward to **gazing**... is actually **present** with us **now** in our **struggles**... by his **Spirit** – dwelling **within**!!

- And his presence... calms us, guides us, empowers us, strengthens us... //
- So cling to his presence ... run to him find refuge in him ...
- And amidst the challenges of today or **tomorrow**... or the coming weeks or the new year... take time out to j**oyfully anticipate** all that it will mean when one day we will Jesus.... and live!
